

Kashmir is in turmoil. The Indian government has imposed curfew, banned all public meetings, arrested more than 20,000 youth and placed the Kashmiri leadership under house arrest or behind the bars. Internet service have been snapped. Barriers have been created everywhere. More than 8.5 million people of Kashmir Valley are under siege since August 5, 2019. The lockdown has cost Kashmir more than \$2.4bn since August, with sectors directly dependent on the internet such as e-commerce and information technology worst hit.

The act of indiscriminate killing of unarmed civilians and assaults on innocent women and children have not been full reported in the world press because the Indian occupation authorities barred the entry of the world media into the territory and the restriction have been imposed even on the local media on reporting any incident that takes place in the Valley of Kashmir.

It is worth mention here that even in today's violent world, the behaviour of the Indian occupation regime in Kashmir is particular in as much as it has enjoyed total impunity. No word of condemnation has been uttered by world powers, nor even a call on India to cease and desist from its near-genocidal campaign. This is not merely a case of passivity and inaction; in practical effect, it amounts to an abetment and encouragement of murderous oppression.

Pakistani Prime Minister called for U.S President Donald Trump and the United Nations to play mediator between his countries and neighbour India over disputed territory in Kashmir. The problem is that India has been taken over by an extremist ideology, which is called Hindutva or the RSS.
